



## NAUMI LIORA

Nestled in the hip enclave of Keong Saik Road within the historic Chinatown district, this younger sibling of the chic Naumi Hotel resides within a restored 1920s Peranakan-styled townhouse, and still preserves several of the building's architectural features including its French-styled windows and 'five-foot way'. With a simple façade of chalk and bright pumpkin, the boutique hotel does exactly as it is named ('Liora' stands for light) – illuminating the area it is in. Within the vicinity, you'll find award-winning restaurants, specialty shops and renowned coffee shops, and just 10 minutes away is the nearest Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) station.

All over, the boutique hotel features a lattice design typical of Peranakan tiles as well as little figurine sculptures created exclusively for the place by local artist KY Huang. The rooms mirror its simple, old-new style; minimally decorated and mostly painted in chalk with bursts of pumpkin that are softened with various shades of brown. Segregated into three categories – Liora Quaint, Heritage and Porch – the rooms are sized ideally for one couple or a group of three to four friends, and fitted with beds that tempt you to sleep in



all day. Although in most cases, the Liora Porch comes with a scenic garden porch, some rooms come with a better view. You'll never go hungry here – a complimentary 24-hour self-serve snack and drinks bar is ready at your service at the lobby.
